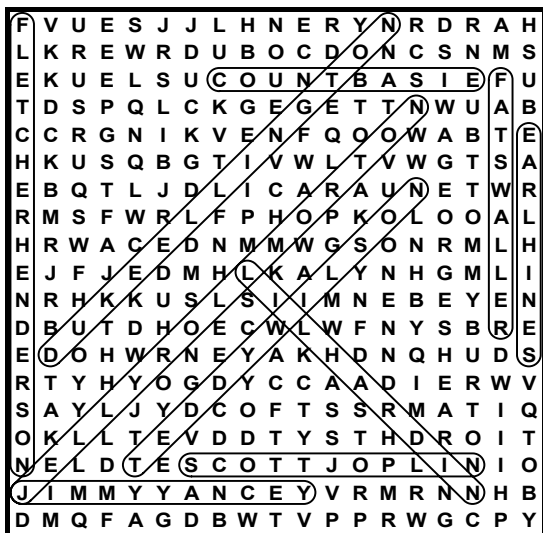

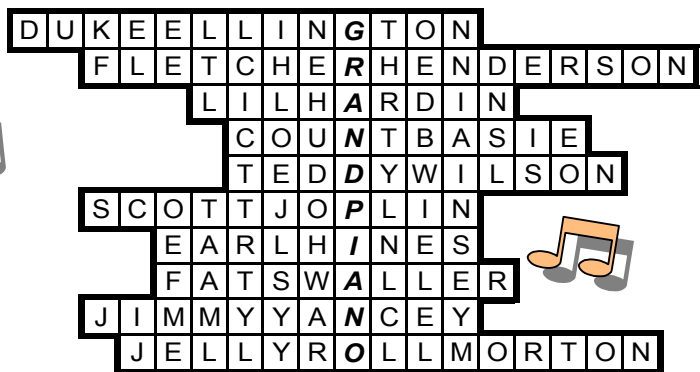
# The 'TEN GREAT JAZZ PIANISTS' Puzzle
