## 41<sup>st</sup> Breda (Holland) Jazz Festival

We were lucky with the weather this year – hot and sunny every day – ideal for the outdoor events that are held around the town. The UK was well represented by artists including Enrico Tomasso, The Jive Aces, Clive Fenton, Sean Moyses, Alan Barnes, Norman Emberson, Mike Sanchez, James Evans and King Pleasure and the Biscuit Boys. The hotel, where we stayed, was one of the Festival sponsors, so we were lucky in having a session there every evening, and of course the obligatory after hours session which went on into the early hours. One of the highlights for me was to see the Dutch Swing College Band, who I last saw in the 70's, their style and professionalism the same as ever. This festival, on which Brecon was modelled, still retains its appeal with the outdoor bandstands featuring international artists with the local musicians. Again, as in the past, with all the crowds we saw no trouble or police. The only downside was, in some outdoor bars, the horrendous price of drinks, but that didn't spoil our enjoyment.
