If reserved by 20th March, and paid for either by cash or cheque, the ticket price will be £6.00. Otherwise it will be £8.00 on the door.


An Evening of Old Style New Orleans Jazz

Band News

The recent BBC Wales TV programme "Week in Week Out" featured members of the Camelia Band & friends in a New Orleans style mini parade to mark the closing of the Engineers which had been the home of jazz, namely the Acme Jazz Band, for the last 25 years or so. The Camelia Band have moved a few streets away to the Oddfellows & Forrester's Club "The Oddy's" in St Mary Street. This hopefully will be their home for the foreseeable future.

A new venture for the Camelia Band is the Riverside Tavern in Newport. As advertised "The Weekend Starts Here" in fact 3pm – 6pm with the Camelia Jazz Band and friends. Bar with Real Ale and hot meals including authentic Creole and Cajun dishes from £2.50. Sounds delicious, give it a try. You can get the Newport Express bus 30X every half hour from Cardiff and the Tavern is just a short walk away. – I nearly forgot – it's every **FRIDAY** Afternoon

A few miles away, on the first Friday of the month is "Trad Night" at the Torfaen Jazz Club in Sebastapol. Ceri Williams is running it and I'll get listings etc and publish them on the web page. This Friday 6th Feb is Martin Butterworth Quartet. So if you live in that area, or fancy a trip, then you know where to go.

Sunday night at the Pen & Wig at the bottom of Stow Hill in Newport. You'll find Ian Phillips and his Band with Roy Davies (tbn), John Davies (clt). Danny McDonald (pno), Mike Gale (bass) and John Bennett (drums) and of course Ian on trumpet. Entertainment for everyone – the audience even join in!. You can also see Ian's Band at the Wheatsheaf in Magor on Thursday 26th Feb and 26th March – they serve good food, so Ian tells me.

Going even further east you come to Magor and the Good Measure Pub which has jazz on the 1st Tuesday of the month featuring Roy Davies (tpt) and "Round the Horn". They have guest musicians each month. On 3rd March you can see Debbie Arthurs, who plays tenor sax and sings.

If you fancy a trip to Bristol and the "Old Duke" on a Friday you can see The Keith Little Band – they are there 13^{th} / 27^{th} Feb and 13^{th} / 27^{th} March. For those who have not been there, you ought to go, it's a fantastic pub which has been presenting jazz for the last 40 years or so – had numerous 'jazzers' through its door, including yours truly with the Riverside Band, and even earlier with the Icon Jazzmen back in the 70's. I wonder if the Riverside poster is still stuck on the ceiling?. Of course, Keith alternates with Liberty St at the Windsor in Penarth (Keith's dates :- $4^{th}/18^{th}$ Feb and March.

I had this drawing from Jim Wood which aptly sums up the Brecon Jazz Management Structure. At the time they had not booked the Adamant Parade Band for the 25th Anniversary after appearing for the preceding 24 years



As stated earlier there will be no Brecon Jazz Festival this year as there is not enough time to organise it. The ACW (Arts Council for Wales) have asked the two favoured applicants to give more details in the hope of having one next year. Keith Little wrote an excellent response to the closure and has given his permission to include it here. All the points made I totally agree with.

"I think it's a shame they are stopping it totally this year. A small token Festival with local bands would have at least kept the flow going and would actually have been very pleasant. I think it's a great shame that the Festival organisers took scant notice of the large amount of feedback and discontent from fans about the Festivals musical direction and presentation. It doesn't surprise me at all that the Festival took a tumble. They were paying vast amounts for guest musicians, many of whom were unknown to general punters. Welsh Bands and musicians were sidelined or rejected altogether and there was a move away from the traditional and swing feel of the Festival. They flew musicians from the States at huge cost when there are phenomenal Bands in European countries at a fraction of the price. I suggested one in particular to the management but it was rejected out of hand. It would be great if with the new management there was a return to the way the festival used to be in the earlier years. Ah well......we'll see. "
