#### **Breda Jazz Festival**



Breda, which is a small town, on the Dutch / Belgium border, hosts an annual Jazz Festival which started back in 1970. Over the years it has attracted virtually all the top international musicians from all over the world. The town come alive with the sound of jazz. There are about 20 venues, most of which have FREE entrance and in the central market square, three open air stages which, have hosted all the top names of jazz.

This is the festival that Brecon was modeled on, whilst Breda retains the original charm Brecon has sadly strayed from those original ideas. What amazes me that

in Holland you can have several hundred people milling around,




#### **Local News**
