Brecon this year – which was supposed to be a celebration of 25 years of jazz was an utter catastrophe as far as seeing and hearing any jazz that resembled our style of music. For a festival which purports to presents all styles of jazz it failed miserably.

Tony Constantenescu,, a founder member of Brecon Jazz Festival, said in an article in the "Brecon & Radnor" that Brecon Jazz had **lost it's soul**. How right he was. There was no New Orleans, Traditional or even Chicago jazz; no street music which normally forms the catalyst that gets the place buzzing. I was told that on the Sunday the centre of Brecon was like a ghost town. Meanwhile at the Cathedral the Adamant Band celebrated 25 consecutive years playing at the jazz service.

The lame excuse that the organisers came up with was the old chestnut "Health & Safety" and lack of money. How do other festivals manage with little or no police presence?, how did 40,000 plus people gather outside Buckingham Palace to welcome the athletes home? They just don't want to know. In my opinion if there is a repeat of this years fiasco Brecon Jazz will just be a thing of the past.

I could go on and on but I think you get the point that I and many others were totally disgusted at the way Brecon has been run on this and the preceding few years.

Some good news for a change. Jazz is back at **The Engineers Arms** in Newport. The band is called **The Camellia Hot Four** with our friends John Minion, Norman & Sarah Thatcher and Steve Davies fronting it. Guests will be dropping in on a regular basis. So for all the Newport New Orleans fans who have been missing their fix, you know where to go on a Monday night. Please give them your support and revive a tradition that the "**Engineers**" will once more be home of New Orleans Jazz in Newport.

Again Many thanks to those who come along on a Tuesday to Café Jazz. Hopefully we will have the Slick City Six and Lewis / Scantlebury All Stars back in the not to distant future.

Another sad loss. I have just been informed that Dr Jonathan Edwards passed away over the week end. John, a lifelong supporter of the Icon, Adamant and other bands had been ill for a few years and was a regular at the Aberaeron Carnival weekend. His funeral will be at Coychurch at 11.30 am next Monday (15th Sept.) We extend to Julie and John's family our deepest sympathy.

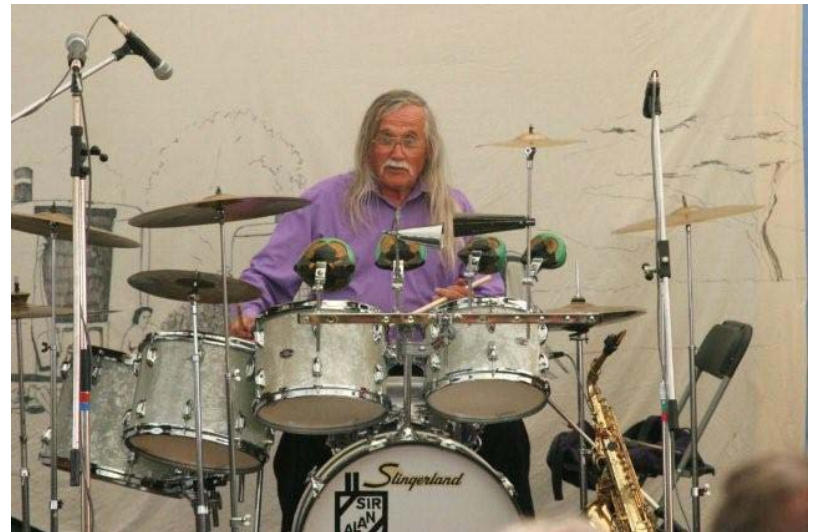
