The Anglo-Welsh Stompers led by banjoist Lynn Saunders completes the October sessions.

November starts with the Wessex New Orleans Band who need no introduction and are followed by the equally popular Memphis Seven. Now for something different. Pete Locke's Nostalgic Jazz. Some of the old Riverside Band will be joining Pete for the evening. Mike Pearce on drums & Mike Gale on Double bass, Sarah and Norman Thatcher and John Scantlebury complete the band with maybe a few numbers from 'Yours Truly'. Next we have John Scantlebury's Surprise Band with trumpeter John Everett, Phil Roberts guitar and Len Thwait bass. John Everett leads the Red Dragon Band based in Hereford area who we may get down in March. The month is completed with Norman Thatcher who will have Sam Sims in his Band.

December is a relatively short month with three sessions The Memphis Seven (tbc) Phil Wall's Jazz Cardinals (with Sam Sims) and the Wessex New Orleans Band.

For the new year we will repeat the same format as last year by having local Quartets, this way, if the weather is bad, it is easy to cancel or re-arrange.
